

Introduction

This month, we will focus on God's commands, specifically the 10 Commandments. These are 10 major commands God gave His people while they were in the wilderness awaiting the land God promised them. Many people in the Church know what they are, so if you don't know them yet, just ask a parent or a leader. When it comes to God's commands, the Bible takes it a couple of steps further than just knowing what they are. We must know them (Step 1), do them (Step 2), and delight in them (Step 3). As you read in the Psalms, you will see an example of someone loving God's commands. In Romans, we get a more detailed description of how we, as Christians, follow God's commands. Following and loving God's commands is difficult, even for Pastors, but God offers His help to us through the Holy Spirit. You don't have to be an expert; pray and ask God to help you understand and love His commands when you read this month.

As you go through the reading each day, write down your answer to these questions: What did this passage teach you about God? What did it teach you about humanity? Did you see the gospel in this passage? Were there any commands given for how you should live? What is something new you learned through this passage?

Weekly Assignment

Each week, come up with one question that you have from the week's reading. Once you have written down that question, go and ask it to a parent, grandparent, small group leader, or any other trustworthy adult in your life.

Memory Challenge

Question: What are the 10 Commandments?

Answer: List the 10 Commandments

Passage: Psalm 19:7-9
