

Introduction

This month, you will get a birds-eye view of the **entire** New Testament. Don't worry, you won't have to read every single chapter; instead, you will spend a little bit of time in a bunch of different New Testament books. You will read about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, interact with stories about the first Christians, and learn about how God wants **you** to live a life of love and obedience to Him **today!**

You will be reading two different types of writing: **Narratives** and **Epistles**. Narratives tell the story about events that happened in the past. The Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) and Acts are Narratives. Their main goal is not to tell you **what to do**; instead, they tell you **what did happen** (but sometimes they do tell us what to do like when Jesus is teaching His disciples). Epistles are letters written by early Church leaders such as Paul or Peter, and they provide instructions on how the Church should act. The main goal of Epistles **is** to tell you **what to do**, and they teach us how God wants us to live, both as individual Christians and in our community at Church.

As you go through the reading each day, answer the following questions. What did this passage teach you about God? What did it teach you about humanity? Did you see the gospel in this passage? Were there any commands given for how you should live? What is something new you learned through this passage?

Memory Challenge

Question: What is the gospel?

Answer: The Good News that Jesus lived, died, and rose again so that we can be forgiven of our sins, adopted as God's children, and receive everlasting life

Passage: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:6-8

Each week, come up with one question that you have from that week's reading. Once you have written down that question, go and ask it to a parent, grandparent, small group leader, or any other trustworthy adult in your life.
